











- Erasmus+ is the EU program for education, training, youth and sport covering the period 2014-2020. It offers a wide range of opportunities for students and staff to study and train abroad and obtain credits which are then recognized by the sending institution.
- The Erasmus+ Program KA 107 International Credit Mobility (ICM) proposes the creation of mobility projects for study and co-operation outside the European Union in Partner Countries Higher Education





This project is funded by the European Union and aims to promote international mobility of students, academic and administration staff to and from non-European countries.

The project has a duration of two years, it started on 1st June 2016 and will end on 31st July 2018.

The Grantees' scholarship will be awarded by selection of criteria of merit and then will be published in the online database. Details of the requirements to participate in the selection can be found online database.





Aims of the program:

- acquisition of language skills;
- promotion of Higher Education;
- strengthening the knowledge for entering into the business world;
- enrich their cultural and professional level;
- development greater intercultural sensitivity;
- development multidisciplinary skills.

Who are the beneficiaries?

Bachelor, Master and PhD exchange students will have the opportunity to carry out a period of study abroad in the Partner Universities. The duration of the mobility range from 3 to 6 months. Students will have the opportunity to attend university courses and make use of the host university structure without having to pay additional fees. Credits (ECTS) will be recognised by the Partner University.

The University of Tuscia will provide assistance with Visa Procedures, Residence Permit, accommodation in the student hostel and Italian language courses. The International Relations Office will be available to support students throughout the period of mobility.





INCOMPATIBILITY

• The same applicant may participate in Erasmus+ mobility periods totaling up to 12 months maximum per each cycle of study (Bachelor or equivalent, Master or equivalent, Doctoral level), independently from the number and type of mobility activities. Previous Erasmus+ experiences must be taken into account for calculation purposes.

· Selected beneficiaries will not be allowed to benefit from any other grant provided by the European Commission for mobility for study / for teaching or training for the same period.

 \cdot Students must carry out their mobility activity in a Program or Partner Country different from the country of the sending organization and the country where the student has his/her accommodation during his/her studies.

 \cdot Candidates with a double nationality must specify the nationality under which they submit their scholarship application.





Italian Courses


At their arrival at Tuscia University Erasmus incoming students will start immediately an Italian course, after an evaluation test in order to estimate the Italian level.
