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
University of Tuscia was born in 1979 and in 1981 its first Academic Year started. The seven departments are partially housed in historical buildings in town, and partially in modern buildings in the outskirts. S. Maria in Gradi, where the Rectorate is located, represents an example of efficient fusion between history and innovation.





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Actually Tuscia University has six departments, which offer 15 undergraduate programmes (Bachelor), 14 second level degree programmes (Master), 2 single cycle degree programmes and 6 PhD courses.

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One of the targets of the Tuscia University's internationalization policy in the medium term is to stipulate Double Degree Agreements with European and Extra European Universities.

A Double Degree is a joint program that allows students of a Master course to:

- Spend the first academic year at home University and the second academic year at a partner University;
- Receive two diplomas, the national Degree (of the home University) and the international Degree (of the host University);
- Create a differentiating factor in the CV of the students.





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Why a Double Degree?

Universities become more visible in the international academic market and can increase their international relevance.

Students can:

- acquire important language skills;
- strengthen the knowledge for entering into the business world;
- increase their cultural and social experiences;
- develop greater intercultural sensitivity and multidisciplinary skills;
- create an international business network;
- be part of an international community;
- gain a passport for an international career.





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Both Universities will define the courses, seminars, exams, internship, thesis preparation and the other credits of the shared programme for a total of 60 ECTS (European Credit Transfer Systems).

Students will be enrolled in both institutions from the beginning of the exchange's academic year.

The enrolment fees and other possible taxes will exclusively be paid at the home institution.



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The courses attended and the exams made be considered valid from the home University for the attainment of the two year Master degree.

At the end of the bi-national courses, each student will develop a thesis under the supervision of Professors nominated by Italian and by Partner authorities.

The Thesis will be discussed in both Universities, following the instructions of each institution. One or more members of the partner institution might be invited to join the board of examiners.



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UNITUS SELECTION

- Italian undergraduate degree with a minimum grade of **100/110**
- English Language (TOEFL, IELTS,..)
- Evaluation of CV and motivational letter
- Previous overall experiences (study, work, personal, extracurricular, etc.)



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In University of Tuscia the steps to stipulate a Double Degree agreement are the following :

- Proposal of the interested professor to approve the agreement to his department;
- Proposal to the Board of Administrator,
and, if approved;
- Proposal to Academic Senate;
- Sign of the Rector.

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FUNDS FOR MOBILITY

The main problem to active a Double Degree programme is the lack of funding.

With the Erasmus Programme we have the possibility to finance the abroad mobility period of the students and the visits of professors.

In particular the new extra-UE mobility opportunity is **the Erasmus+ Programme International Credit Mobility (ICM)** that proposes the creation of mobility projects for study and cooperation outside the European Union.



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In June 2016 and in June 2017 University of Tuscia has been selected for an Erasmus International Credit Mobility KA107 project. These projects, funded by the European Union, promote the international mobility of students, academic and administration staff to and from Armenia, Georgia, Bosnia Herzegovina, Russia, Albania and Nepal .

First project has a duration of two years, from 1st June 2016 to 31st July 2018. The second project started from 1st June 2017 to 31st July 2019.



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International Credit Mobility finance

Student mobility

- From 5 days to 2 months (excl. travel days)
- Minimum 8 teaching hours per week

€ 160/day for outgoing staff**





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INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS OFFICE

Through the **ERASMUS PROGRAMME**, which provides many scholarships every year, the **University of Tuscia** hosts approximately one hundred students every year from the European Union countries. The International Relations Office is a reference point for visiting students, who are welcomed, given assistance with any possible early difficulties in settling in or help finding accommodation. There are free Italian language courses, the possibility to stay in contact with their home universities and individual support to cover all requirements.


